WHITE CHOCOLATE CHEESECAKE

INGREDIENTS

185g Crushed biscuits
90 g melted butter
500g cream cheese softened
350g condensed milk
100g white chocolate
1 tbs gelatin powder
¼ cup hot water
¾ cup cream

Step 1 – sprinkle gelatin over hot water and allow to cool

Step 2 – crumble biscuit and combine with melted butter, press into pan and refrigerate.

Step 3 – beat cream cheese and condensed milk until smooth, beat in the cream

Step 4 – Melt white chocolate and allow to c

Step 5 – beat white chocolate and gelatin int mixture and spoon evenly over base.
